

Piece Maker Quilters


Wednesdays from 1:00 pm—4:00 pm in the Fellowship Hall.


Adult Forum with Pastor Teuscher

This month's video topic will be "The Case for Easter" written by Lee Strobel. Strobel was an atheist, professional homicide investigator who had tried to determine whether Jesus was actually dead before He was taken down from the cross and buried and whether Jesus defied all naturalistic explanations by rising from the dead three days later. It was a very difficult assignment for someone who was, at the time, a hyper-skeptical atheist, who did not believe in the Bible, denied all miracles as phony stunts and felt the resurrection was ridiculous.

Join us to see how the Holy Spirit, over several years of his investigation, brought Strobel to the conviction that the death and resurrection of Jesus was real and that during the next 40 days, the risen Jesus had actually appeared on ten different occasions to people who knew Him. Strobel will also tell us about other investigators who also found solid evidence that met modern investigative standards of proof, that the writers of the New Testament were honest and correct in their proclamation of the empty tomb and the reports of eyewitnesses who personally saw and heard the Risen Savior.


This is important to us today because without the resurrection, the Christian faith could not have come into being and remained so solid over 2,000 years. The disciples would have remained frightened, crushed and defeated men. The cross would have remained the sad and shameful end of a phony teacher but, with the truth of the crucifixion and that God raised His Son from the grave, the resurrection proclaimed by the Christian faith is the greatest news the world has ever heard!

The Letters of Peter and Jude





Financial Summary for February 2019:

Giving Results

Giving was *under* budget by (\$23,273) for the month of February and *under* budget by (\$73,261) for FYTD2019.

Weekly giving is down compared to the same time last year.

Some donors have shifted giving from General Fund to Capital Campaign.

Spending

Spending was *under* budget by (\$36,379) in February and *under* budget by (\$240,162) for FYTD2019.

Church payroll and benefits are under budget as both the DCE and Associate Pastor positions were budgeted for a full year and have not been filled yet.

Preschool and Kindergarten (PS&K)

PS&K Net Income was *over* budget by \$12,847 in February and *under* budget by (\$2,777) for FYTD2019.

Nearly all of the beginning of the year deficit to budget has been eliminated.

The Preschool is now at budgeted levels of enrollment.

We will continue to have cost control on our variable costs of labor and food.

Net Operating Cash

As of February 28, 2019, Operating Cash is a *positive* of \$48,578 which is an *increase* of \$85,135 from January.

We expect monthly Operating Cash to continue to improve for the remainder of the fiscal year.
