LWML Mission Grant Updates

God says, “Before I formed you in the womb I knew you...”. The Sanctity of Life created by God and the family as God designed it has been under attack by pro-choice organizations. An LWML Grant of \$92,000 has been given to develop “Life” curriculums (*age appropriate*) to be used in LCMS schools.

Thirst to Learn: Bible Books for Africa’s Children received a \$100,000 grant. Africa’s population is more than 1.2 billion people. Islam has made huge inroads in the Continent. Lutheran Heritage Foundation has translated, published and distributed Bible books to help Christian missionaries spread the light of the Gospel.



Bible Study: Paul’s Letters to Titus and Timothy

We all have been in a position of answering to a leader of one sort or another: bosses, mentors, teachers, and such. Looking back, we recognize that some leaders were clearly gifted for the task, while others sadly seemed not up to the task. However, sometimes the problems encountered may have been the result of people refusing to follow direction or setting off on their own directions away from the group. If expectations aren’t clear, problems can result.

Such was the case for St. Paul and the churches he started. Once he turned leadership of those churches over to others and moved on elsewhere, disagreements and divisions began to unravel those churches. On the island of Crete and in the city of Ephesus, the once thriving and effective churches there began to bicker and break. In response, Paul wrote a letter to each of the leaders he had put in charge – Titus and Timothy – to clarify what is expected of church leaders and church members. Paul considered Titus and Timothy as his “sons” in the faith, and these letters served to nurture them and their congregations.

Paul’s advice to those early churches applies to us at Risen Savior just as much today as it did to the congregations Titus and Timothy were leading. What should we expect of our leaders? What should those leaders expect of us?

This Sunday Adult Bible Study will dive into Paul’s letter to Titus and his second letter to Timothy to discover what values we should seek to model to the world as members of our community of faith here at Risen Savior Lutheran Church. Led by Barry Ritchie, this study will discuss the many lessons these letters hold for us. RSVP to britchie11@juno.com.









Sunday Ministry Partner Sign-up Process

Our Sunday morning Service Team Leader positions are scheduled through Planning Center. We are using a tool in Planning Center called “Sign-up-Sheets”. Rather than the office scheduling, now you will be able to choose which Sundays/services you’d like to serve.



At the beginning of each month you will receive an email asking you to select which Sundays you would like to serve. These dates will be saved in your Planning Center account and you’ll receive reminder emails as the date approaches.

We know that some of our married couples that use Planning Center share the same email address. If you do, here’s what we need ONE of you to do: (One of you may keep your current password, but the other needs to create a new one). Financial Summary for December 31, 2021

Giving Results

Giving was **over** budget by \$22,774 for the month of December and is **under** budget (\$20,344) for CYE2021.

Tracked Giving was **over** by \$19,904 and Loose Plate was **over** by \$2,871.

Loose Plate for November and December were at pre-COVID levels

Spending

Spending was **under** budget by (\$5,261) for the month of December and **under** budget (\$126,580) for CYE2021.

Preschool and Kindergarten (PS&K)

PS&K Net Income was **over** budget by \$70,108 for the month of December and at budget for CYE2021.

In December \$70,989 was transferred to PS&K Income from funds on the Balance Sheet.

This represents grant money from the state that is to be used to defray costs for Early Childhood Centers due to the effects of the pandemic.

Net Operating Cash

As of December 31, 2021, Operating Cash is a **positive** \$90,943 which is a net **positive** change of \$128,032 from November 30, 2021. This was impacted by the transfer of PS&K funds to Income.



1 Corinthians 12:31b-13:13 - And I will show you a still more excellent way. If I speak in the tongues of men and of angels, but have not love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but have not love, I am nothing. If I give away all I have, and if I deliver up my body to be burned, but have not love, I gain nothing. Love is patient and kind; love does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth. Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends. As for prophecies, they will pass away; as for tongues, they will cease; as for knowledge, it will pass away. For we know in part and we prophesy in part, but when the perfect comes, the partial will pass away. When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became a man, I gave up childish ways. For now we see in a mirror dimly, but then face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I have been fully known. So now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; but the greatest of these is love.
