



## The Letters of Peter and Jude



## Risen Savior Monthly Financial Review

#### Did you know?

Many Risen Savior congregants have opted to use all or part of their *Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs)* as a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)?

If you are age 70½ or older, IRS rules require you to take required minimum distributions (RMDs) each year from your tax-deferred retirement accounts. This additional taxable income may push you into a higher tax bracket and may also reduce your eligibility for certain tax credits and deductions. To eliminate or reduce the impact of RMD income, you may donate to Risen Savior or any other qualified non-profit using a qualified charitable distribution (QCD). #### Financial Summary for December 2018:

#### Giving Results

Giving was *under* budget by (\$36,395) for the month of December and *under* budget by (\$62,884) for FYTD2019.

#### Spending

Spending was *under* budget by (\$30,789) in December and *under* budget by (\$161,083) for FYTD2019.

Church payroll and benefits are under budget as both the DCE and Associate Pastor positions were budgeted for a full year and have not been filled.

#### Preschool and Kindergarten (PS&K)

PS&K Net Income was *over* budget by \$2,496 in December and *under* budget by (\$36,491) for FYTD2019.

We continue to increase the enrollment at the Preschool through the use of marketing and referrals.

We continue to have cost control on our variable costs of labor and food.

#### Net Operating Cash

As of December 31, 2018, Operating Cash is a *negative* of (\$82,440) which is an *increase* of \$15,968 from November.
