- Students arrive in the fall (August)
- Students provide their own funds for clothing, entertainment, personal hygiene items, sports activities, uniforms, and spending money
- Students have their own health insurance
- Students are from all over the world including: Italy, Japan, Germany, China, Thailand, Sweden, France and more!

# Risen Savior Monthly Financial Review

The following is a summary of financial activity for Risen Savior Lutheran Church. If you would like more detailed reports, please contact our Business Manager, Susan Mello at [mellos@rslcs.org](mailto:mellos@rslcs.org).

## Did you know?

For the purpose of reporting our financial results, we are now referring to the Early Learning Center (ELC) as our Preschool and Kindergarten (PS&K) as this more accurately describes Risen Savior's early childhood program. We are committed to providing a quality education as evidenced by our national accreditation (NAEYC) and participation locally in Quality First. We are blessed to share the love of Jesus each day with nearly 150 young children.

## Financial Summary for April 2018:

- Giving Results
  - For April, Giving was **under** budget by (\$9,439) and is **over** budget \$56,003 for FYTD18.
  - Looking forward to May month end, Giving should be at or close to budget. Giving is still projected to be **over** budget for the fiscal year.
- Spending
  - Spending was **over** budget in April by \$2,170 and **under** budget (\$66,107) FYTD18.
  - Expenses were over budget this month primarily due to a \$25,000 accrual to our Ministry Expansion Fund.
- Preschool and Kindergarten (PS&K)
  - PS&K Net Income was **over** budget by \$13,973 for the month of April 2018. For FYTD18, the ELC net income is **over** budget \$55,757.
- Net Operating Cash is \$205,020 which is a positive increase of \$45,672 from March 2018. While there has been excellent control on spending, much of this positive Operating Cash is due to timing of expenses as well as not having a full time DCE yet. As a comparison to last fiscal year, Net Operating Cash for April 2017 was \$160,352.
