At the beginning of each month you will receive an email asking you to select which Sundays you would like to serve. These dates will be saved in your Planning Center account and you'll receive reminder emails as the date approaches.

We know that some of our married couples use Planning Center share the same email address. If you do, here's what we need ONE of you to do: (One of you may keep your current password, but the other needs to create a new one). We are still looking for someone who is able to complete a hand sewn quilt.


So far this year we have made:

• 10:10 am: The Gospel According to Matthew

The Gospel of Matthew proclaims the life of Jesus as the climax of the Bible's story and human history. God's promise of deliverance from sin and death arrived in human flesh in the person of Jesus. This gospel reveals Jesus as the long-awaited fulfillment of Old Testament prophecies and the expectations of God's chosen people for a Savior and King.

Did you know?



IRA Holders Over 70 ½ years of age with an Annual Required Minimum Distribution (RMD)

Beginning in 2018, the Federal standard deduction will increase to \$24,000. If you previously itemized deductions on your Form 1040, Schedule A and will now be utilizing the increased standard deduction, there are some potential tax savings for those with an IRA who pay an annual RMD.

You may request a one-time distribution from your IRA Authorized Agent for a check to be made out to Risen Savior Lutheran Church for the annual amount of your church donation. The amount of that check is tax-free and will reduce your initial RMD balance.

Example- RMD due: \$20,000, tax rate 25%, taxes paid \$5000 One time check to Risen Savior for annual contribution: \$6000 Remaining RMD due: \$14,000, tax rate 25%, taxes due \$3500

Tax Savings: \$1500

Tax circumstances vary by individual. Please consult your tax professional to determine how this will best benefit you.

Financial Summary for May 2018:

- Giving Results
 - o For May, Giving was *over* budget by \$2,371 and is *over* budget \$58,375 for FYTD18.
 - o Looking forward to June month end, Giving should be close or slightly below budget based on month to date giving. Giving is still projected to be *over* budget for the fiscal year.
- Spending
 - Spending was *over* budget in May by \$30,372 and *under* budget (\$35,375) FYTD18.
 - Expenses were over budget this month primarily due to a \$25,000 accrual to our Ministry Expansion Fund.
- Preschool and Kindergarten (PS&K)
 - o PS&K Net Income was *under* budget by (\$1,765) for the month of May 2018. For FYTD18, the PS&K net income is *over* budget \$53,991.
- Net Operating Cash is \$136,178 which is a *decrease* of (\$68,282) from April 2018. While there has been excellent control on spending, much of this positive Operating Cash is due to timing of expenses as well as not having a full time DCE yet. As a comparison to last fiscal year, Net Operating Cash for May 2017 was \$183,877.
